Emmy-award winner Lisa Jackson will discuss "The Greatest Silence: Rape in the Congo" which won a special jury prize at the 2008 Sundance Film Festival and has been nominated for the Eric Park Award for Social Justice at the Indianapolis International Film Festival. "The Greatest Silence" examines rape's use as a weapon that destabilizes economies and communities, and scars generations of women and their children. Critics agree: Jackson takes on difficult subjects "with intelligence and courage," and is "remarkably adept in getting her subjects to speak frankly and thoughtfully."
